

#### New York Police-Reported Motor Vehicle Fatalities & Serious Injuries






Is the loss of an average of 1,055 lives on NY roadways every year acceptable?




# New York vs. U.S. Motor Vehicle Fatalities: % Change from 2013






# New York vs Large State Motor Vehicle Fatalities: % Change from 2013






#### New York vs U.S. Observed Front Seat Belt Use Rate






# New York vs U.S. Fatalities Involving a Drinking Driver: % Change from 2013

#### New York Drivers Ticketed for Alcohol Impairment




Drivers Ticketed for Alcohol Impairment (TSLED Only)






# New York vs U.S. Fatalities Involving a Large Truck: % Change from 2013


# New York Large Truck Fatalities: Alcohol/Drug-Related Drivers





Large Truck Fatalities with an Alcohol/Drug-Related Driver














# New York vs U.S. Pedestrian Fatalities: % Change from 2013










- % Pedestrian Drug Use among Total Pedestrian Fatalities

- % Pedestrian Substance Use among Total Pedestrian Fatalities














#### New York vs U.S. Speed-Related Fatalities: % Change from 2013










## New York Fatalities Involving a Drug-Related Driver


#### New York Fatalities Involving Drug-Related vs. Alcohol-Related Drivers







### New York Prevalence of Adult Cannabis Use Self-Reported – Past Month






## Prevalence of Adult Cannabis Use by State Self-Reported – Past Month 2018 - 2019





### New York Impaired Driving Population Self Reported 2018-2019






# **Key Takeaways**

- Prior to the legalization of cannabis in New York, driving under the influence of cannabis was three times more prevalent than driving under the influence of alcohol only.
- Driving under the combined influence of alcohol and drugs was more prevalent than driving under the influence of alcohol only.




### New York Impaired Driving Population by Age Self Reported 2018-2019





## New York Drivers Arrested for Impaired Driving by Charges







# Gaps in impaired driving data

- In 2016, a year with 45,176 impaired-driving arrests statewide, 4,903
  (10.8%) of all impaired cases were submitted for drug testing (TWG, 2016).
- Of the 4,903 drug impaired cases, 1,724 (35%) DRE evaluations were conducted.
- Without sufficient drug testing or drug impairment evaluations, it is unclear how many of the impaired driving arrests are associated with recent drug use.
- The lack of drug testing or drug-impairment evaluations leads to underreporting.
- A Statewide Toxicology Database is being developed by ITSMR.




## New York Impaired Driving Arrests vs. DRE Evaluations
