

### **Oral Fluid Roadside Screening Guidelines**

## **Important Reminders:**

- Time is critical
- Evidential testing not a replacement for documenting:
  - Observed behaviors
  - Signs of impairment
- Roadside screening has limitations:
  - Number of drugs is limited
  - If impairment is evident and screening is negative, consult a DRE
- This is a guideline and may vary based on:
  - Case specific events
  - Officer training
  - Agency protocols
- Follow the DWI Detection Process:



## Phase 1

- Task 1 Observe vehicle in operation
  - Decision to stop car
- Task 2 Observe stopping sequence



### Phase 2

- Task 1 Observe and interview the driver
  - Possibly ask to exit
  - Additional tests?
- Task 2 Observation of exit



# Phase 3

- Task 1 SFSTs
  - HGN
  - Walk and Turn
  - One Leg Stand
  - Other FSTs
    - FTN, LOC, MR



## Phase 3 cont'd...

- Task 2 Preliminary Field Tests
  - PBT
  - Roadside Oral Fluid
    - If non-DRE, consider prior to DRE contact
    - If DRE, conduct themselves



## Phase 3 cont'd...

- Task 2 cont'd...
  - Decision to call DRE
    - Decision made per agency protocols
    - Every attempt to call DRE



# Toxicology

- Collect evidential sample for toxicology
  - Obtain a blood sample ASAP
  - Consider Oral Fluid sample



### **Roadside Oral Fluid Questionnaire Results**

- 130 Total Responses from:
  - 45 Counties (4 currently using instruments)
- How many agencies would participate if instrument provided?
  - 121
- Biggest challenges to a roadside oral fluid program?
  - 77 lack of information about instruments and how to use them
  - 45 too expensive
- Would maintenance cause issues for your agency?
  - 29 yes
  - 93 no
- Majority stated they would prefer an instruction card be provided
- Lack of authorization under 1194(1)(b)?
  - 63 would be a stumbling block
  - 56 would not be a stumbling block



- Too Expensive
  - Grant funding may possibly be available for the 2025 grant year from:
    - GTSC
    - OCM
  - Or, during the 2024 grant year if already written into proposals



- Lack of information
  - Covered at the beginning of this section
  - Training videos available through manufacturers
  - Please reach out to the NYS Oral Fluid Committee if additional questions



- Maintenance issues
  - Instruments are proving to be rugged
  - Annual maintenance requirements may be removed (ex: Intox)
  - Maintenance only required if instrument is malfunctioning (not common)



- Lack of authorization under 1194(1)(b)
  - Roadside is voluntary only at this time
    - Refusal possible, especially given all of the other tests requested
  - Pilot studies have not showed high rate of refusal
  - Remember to use your verbal judo!



#### **Conclusion**

- Provides another tool in a patrol officer's toolbox
- Added confidence to make arrest
  - Remember, negative results with impairment, call a DRE and...
    - Trust your SFSTs / FSTs
    - If you don't feel safe letting them drive away, don't!
